SCIENCE WEEK

This week has been British Science Week. This year, the themes were 'time' and 'smashing stereotypes'. In assembly on Monday, we discussed the fields of science. Ideas for being a scientist at home...

How many 'single use plastics' do you have at home? What could you use to replace 'single use plastics' in your home?

Using your observational skills, search for butterflies and moths and see which ones are tricky to spot. Why some are easier to find than others?

Investigate which parts of your home get sun at which times of the day. Are there some parts that don't get any sun?

With so much food needed, food waste is a massive challenge. How could you combat this at home? Maybe you could write a new recipe to use up leftover food!

Can you carry on the jelly experiment at home! Try using different sized and shaped bowls and see if this changes the time jelly takes to set.

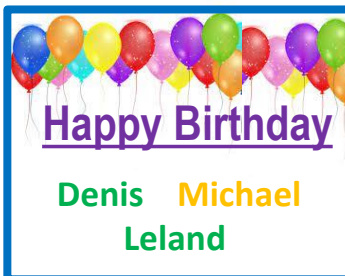

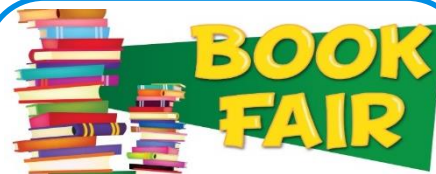
