Year 2 We have been learning about units of measurement. We explored capacity using millilitres, mass using grams and length using centimetres. We also became sculptors, where created a model of Rapunzel's tower using clay. We used various techniques like pinching, stretching and rolling.

















Year 1 In English this week we have been reading a book called 'Stanley's Stick'. We pretended our stick was a flying carpet, doll, rocket, tent or microphone. We labelled our sticks and we wrote what they can do. We used the conjunction 'and' to join two ideas together. For example: 'My stick is a rocket and it can fly high in the sky.' For our Geography work we went for a walk in our local area. We used maps to follow the route and identify points of interest, like shops or playgrounds.





Reception We have been learning all about the Arctic and Antarctic this week. We have read and written facts about some of the animals we would find there. Did you know the Antarctic (South Pole) can be as cold as - 60°C? We became artists and made our own interpretations of the Northern Lights.
